

Dalhousie Lake

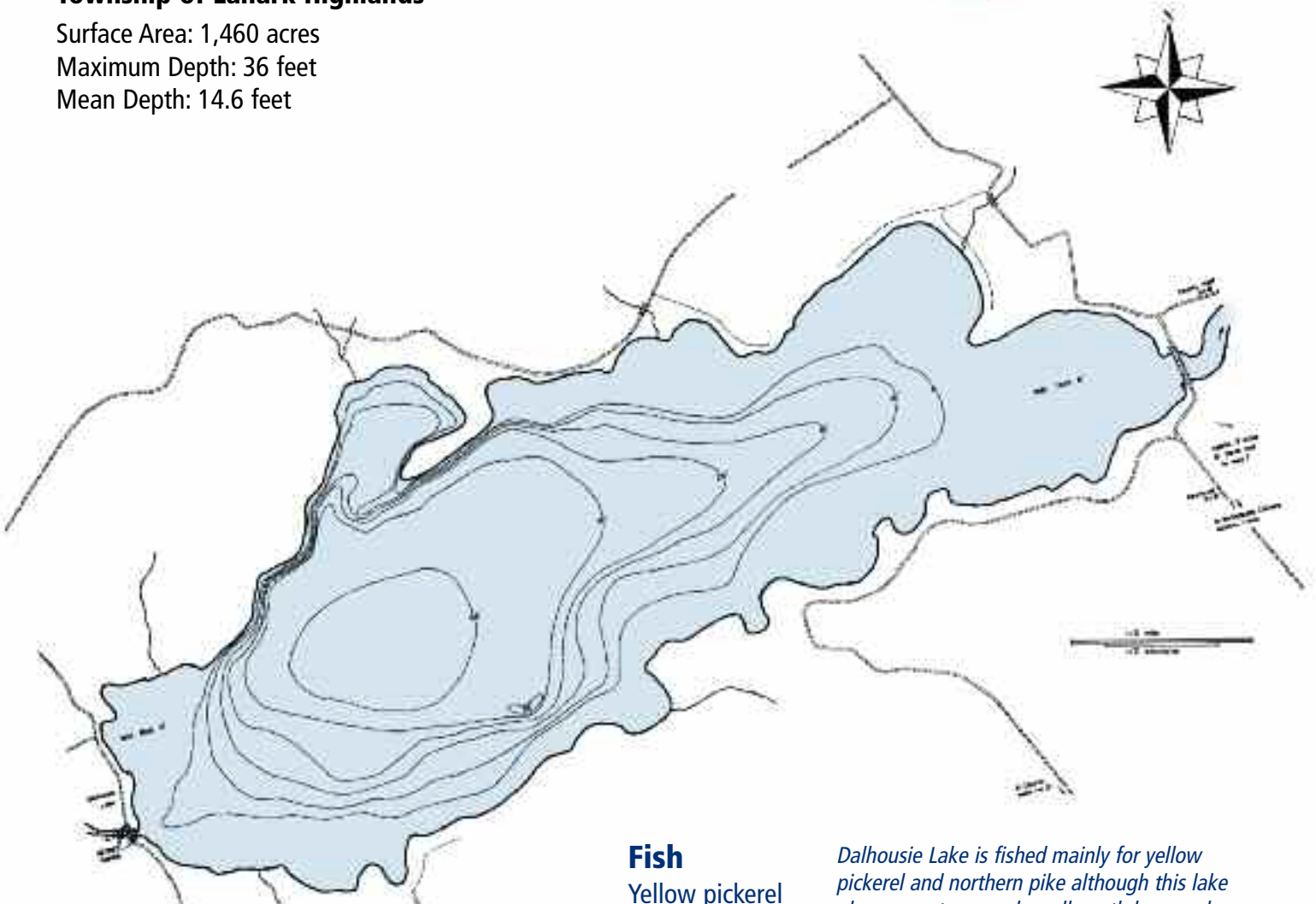

Directions

Leave Highway 7 at Perth and travel North on County Road 511 to the village of Balderson. At Balderson, turn onto County Road 7 (Fallbrook Road) and follow it west and then north for 5.6 miles to the intersection of County Roads 7 and 12. Turn left onto County Road 12. Turn right onto Lavant Mill Road. Access is on the right before the bridge. There are washrooms, a playground and an unsupervised swimming & picnic area at this site.

Dalhousie Lake is fished mainly for yellow pickerel and northern pike although this lake also supports a good smallmouth bass and panfish fishery. Yellow pickerel fishing is good early in the season while fishing for either this fish or northern pike is fair during summer months. Winter fishing is quite popular with a seventeen pound northern pike caught through the ice in February, 1971. Yellow pickerel spawn during the spring at the head of Dalhousie Lake at Geddes' Rapids.
