Public access can be found off of Highway #7, East of Perth at Drummond Conc. 9A. Access to Mississippi Lake can also be gained by the Mississippi River at the Municipal Park in Carleton Place on Lake Avenue West for larger watercraft. There are other boat launching facilities supplied by commercial campground operators around the lake.

Mississippi Lake is one of the largest warm-water fisheries in Lanark County with yellow bickerel, northern pike, largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, and panfish being taken by anglers. Yellow pickerel fishing in the early season is very good in the Innisville area of the lake, and in the spring the yellow pickerel spawn in large numbers attracting people to witness the yearly spawning run. During summer months, angling success is regarded as good for all species.
