

Upper Rideau Lake

Tay Valley Township, Township of Drummond / North Elmsley (North and South Elmsley, North & South Burgess)

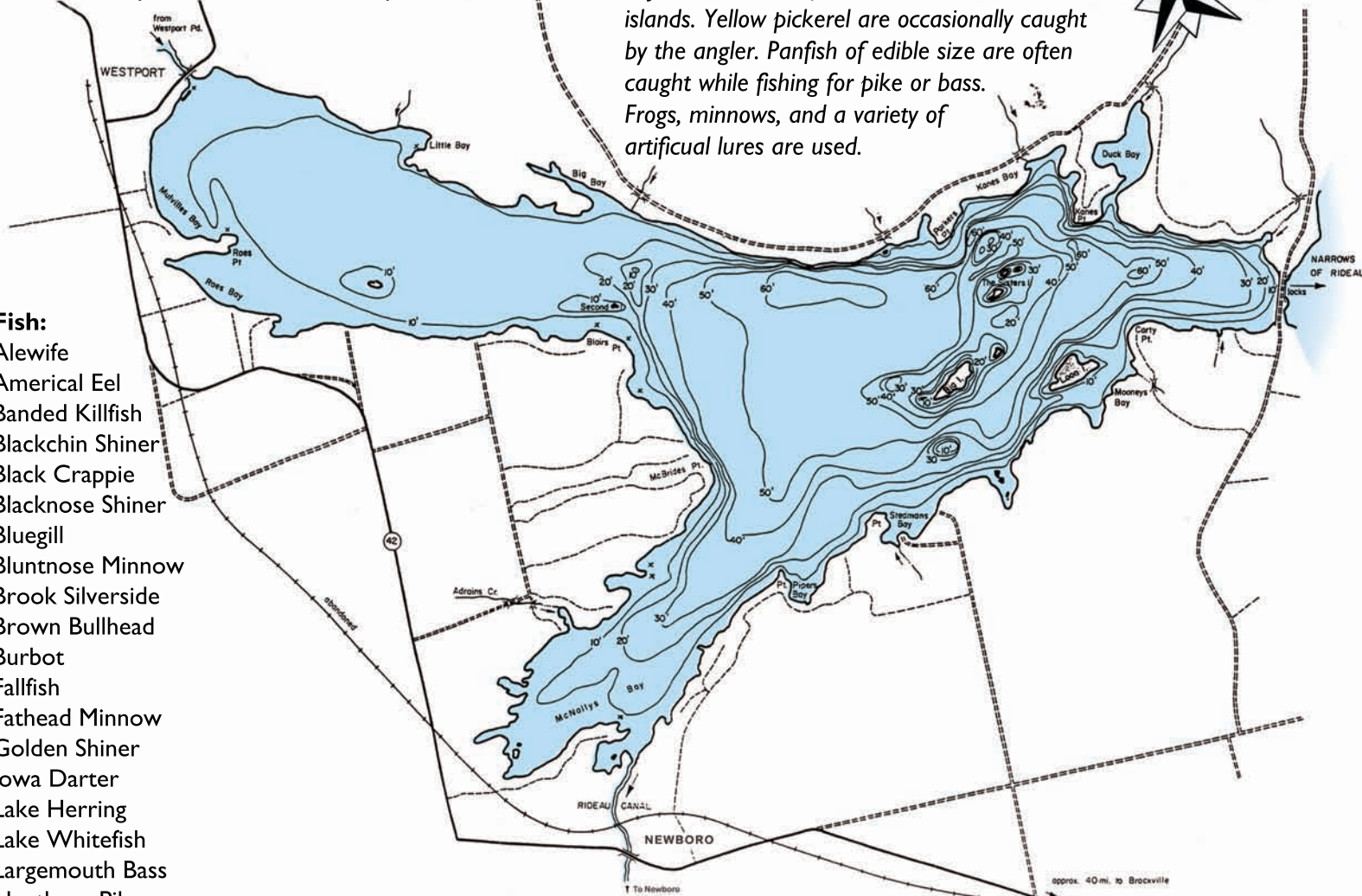
Surface Area: 16010 acres

Manimum Depth: 328 feet, Mean Depth: 40.4 feet

Northern pike, largemouth bass and smallmouth bass are successfully angled adjacent to most of the main shoreline and islands. Yellow pickerel are occasionally caught by the angler. Panfish of edible size are often caught while fishing for pike or bass. Frogs, minnows, and a variety of artifiucal lures are used.

The Upper Rideau Lake is located 60 km North of Kingston at the village of Westport. It can also be reached by watercraft via the Rideau Canal System through a series of locks from either the Big Rideau Lake, Lower Rideau Lake or the Rideau River. A number of tourist resorts and camps have been established on the system. Public access can also be reached by following County Road #10 West of Perth then heading South on the Narrows Lock Road (County Road #14). There is a good launch on the West side before crossing the bridge. Parking is available.
